#### Opinion

- 1. We have audited the accompanying standalone annual financial results ('the Statement') of M/s Kabirdas Investments Limited ('the Company') for the year ended 31 March, 2020, attached herewith, being submitted by the Company pursuant to the requirements of Regulation 33 of the SEBI (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015 (as amended) ('Listing Regulations'), including relevant circulars issued by the SEBI from time to time.
